Instructions

In this assignment, you will undertake a comprehensive review and critical analysis, of Perez, T. S. (2019). In support of situated ethics: ways of building trust with stigmatised 'waste pickers' in Cape Town. *Qualitative Research*, 19(2), 148–163. You can find the article in the D2L course e-reserves. The paper should focus on the ethical considerations and research methods employed. The goal is to develop a deeper understanding and opinion of the importance of ethical conduct in research and to evaluate the appropriateness of the methods used in generating meaningful, ethical, and reliable results.

- Identify any vulnerable populations involved and access the measures taken to protect rights and welfare.

The paper should be 5 pages in length, and no longer than 6 pages, typed 12 point font, double spaced, with standard margins. It should include proper academic referencing using APA format. The referencing format must be consistent throughout the paper.

As this is an academic paper the use of "I" statements should be avoided. If you are not familiar with writing a critical analysis please consult all available resources like the writing centre, academic coaches, and librarians for additional help.
